Update on 2010 Legislative Session

Get the latest update from the Indiana Council legislative team as we provide an overview of the legislation currently pending in the Indiana General Assembly. As bills are filed that impact the service delivery, operations, tax status, and other potential changes, it is critical that the membership understand what proposed bills are under consideration and what strategies will be used to either promote or oppose potential changes.

Federal Reform – The Latest from Washington DC

As the US Congress moves forward with a unified bill related to federal healthcare reform, find out the up-to-the-minute status of the federal legislation. Hear from Chuck Ingoglia, our National Council legislative liaison as he provides an update from Washington DC. Currently in the two versions of the bill certain aspects help community mental health centers. Other aspects of the legislation don't go far enough to address the issues facing community mental health and Medicaid. Hopefully, through our national efforts the final version of the bill will address our concerns and issues and this session will help you better understand those potential impacts.

Informatics, Effectiveness & Cost: How Cost Effectiveness Data Will Shape the Future of the Behavioral Health Field

This session features a nationally respected researcher who happens to reside in Indiana! Hear from Dennis Morrison, Centerstone Research Institute, as he provides information on how the use of innovative strategies, combined with evidence-based practices, practice-based evidence and consumer input can work together to improve community mental health care in an increasingly electronic environment. This interesting session has been highlighted at a number of national conferences and it will leave the participants with new insights into the future delivery of care within the community mental health environment.

Luncheon Keynote Address - Meet the new Executive Director of the Indiana Primary Healthcare Association

New to his role as the leader of the Indiana Primary Healthcare Association, hear from Phil Morphew, Executive Director. Phil brings many years of in-

volvement in the healthcare industry in Indiana to this challenging position. As more and more focus is placed on the integration of primary and behavioral healthcare, take this opportunity to hear from Phil as he provides an overview of his membership of Community Health Centers and explains the process by which centers are deemed "federally qualified health centers" and how their overall operations function under federal and state funding.

Community Health Centers – How they are Designated and Funded

In an effort to continue our due diligence on the internal operations of community health centers, hear from the state agency staff who work closely with IPHCA on the establishment and funding processes for community health centers. This session will provide participants with increased knowledge on the State Department of Health oversight of community health centers and how their operation may or may not make sense for community mental health centers going forward. The state agency over CHCs also oversees the underserved designation determination and they will provide additional information on this important program as an added bonus to this presentation.

Community Health Centers – Financial Information and Benchmarking

Hear from a national consultant who is a leader in the financial background and operation of community health centers. BKD, LLP has been providing financial services to community health centers across the nation, and this session will enhance the participant's knowledge of the financial, demographic and benchmarking aspects of community health centers, so that increased knowledge of their operations and viability is better understood. This session will help community mental health centers better understand if this combined model of service delivery is the future of community health.

ARRA – New Opportunities for Community Mental Health

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 introduced major changes in funding criteria for the nation's mental health system, including community mental health. This session will provide an update on the impact of ARRA related to Medicaid funding and grants and incentives for the implementation and use of healthcare information technology. It will also include discussion of Health Information Exchanges (HIEs) and how participation in HIEs can help meet the interoperability requirements for ARRA grants.
