ICCMHC WINTER QUARTERLY MEETING: FEBRUARY 8-10, 2012

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) presents many challenges and opportunities for the community mental health center provider. With the expected expanded pool of eligible Medicaid recipients, community mental health centers must have the infrastructure to effectively provide behavioral health services to those in need. By encouraging the integration of behavioral health and primary health services, to the concept of Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs) and the Healthcare Home model, community mental health providers must be positioned for the future. As the specialized healthcare home model is gaining momentum through the approval of Medicaid State Plans Amendments in both Missouri and Rhode Island, it becomes critical that both CEOs and the executive management teams within the CMHC system fully understand and consider the validity of these concepts. By working collaboratively, we must work to understand how we envision the integrated care and healthcare home model should look in Indiana for people with chronic behavioral health conditions. How will community mental health centers need to change to become a healthcare home for the population they serve? Attend this conference and help answer this critical question.

A representative from Rhode Island will be presenting at this conference on how their state was able to collaboratively develop a healthcare home model that has been approved by CMS. In addition, a representative from the National Council for Community Behavioral Healthcare (NCCBH) will provide an overview of other efforts currently occurring throughout the United States in pursuit of the healthcare home model. In the afternoon session, CMHCs will meet collectively to discuss the activities of the current committees developing specific information and models to be used in a strategic plan aimed at presenting a potential healthcare system for Indiana, specific to the treatment of chronic behavioral health conditions.

Some of the questions these sessions will answer include:

1. What is the latest from the Indiana General Assembly on legislation impacting community mental health center operations?
2. How did both Missouri and Rhode Island craft a CMS approved healthcare home model specific to the treatment of chronic mental health conditions using the community mental health center system?
3. What does the Indiana Hospital Association see as the future of Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs) and how do hospitals propose to integrate chronic mental health services?
4. What are the latest reports from the chairs of the Action Planning Committees related to the healthcare home action plan?

**BRIEF LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

This session will provide attendees with a brief overview of current legislation occurring in the Indiana Statehouse related to community mental health and the healthcare industry in general. With difficult labor issues facing the Indiana General Assembly and no indication of ACA related legislation from the State of Indiana, this session is expected to be quick and challenging. Attend this session and get the latest on pending bills and how these proposals may impact your CMHC operations.

**THE HEALTHCARE HOME MODEL— MODELS FOR EXAMINATION**

This critical morning session is dedicated to expanding your current knowledge of the specialized healthcare home model and how states are crafting programs that have been approved by CMS. This session will be key-noted by Elizabeth Earls, President and CEO of the Rhode Island Council of Community Mental Health Organizations, who will provide an overview of the process used in Rhode Island to establish a healthcare home model. In addition, the NCCBH will provide an overview of current healthcare home and ACA implementation programs occurring throughout the United States. This session is an important “primer” for how Indiana could develop similar approved programs.

**THE ROLE OF PSYCHIATRY IN INTEGRATING HEALTHCARE**

We know that we cannot effectively meet the behavioral needs of consumers if we ignore the fact that individuals with SMI, on average die 25 years earlier than the general population and that 60% of these premature deaths are due to medical conditions, such as cardiovascular disease and pulmonary and infectious diseases that are either going undiagnosed or untreated. As a result, the role of psychiatry in integrated healthcare becomes a critical link to improved health outcomes. Wellness and prevention are as important as treatment and rehabilitation and in order to truly improve outcomes and the quality of life for the individuals we serve, we have to focus more attention on the general health care problems that interfere with recovery. Attend this session and get important insights into how Regional Mental Health Center is collaborating with primary care and is moving forward to ensure these important considerations are being addressed.

**LUNCHEON KEYNOTE ADDRESS**

The President and CEO of the Indiana Hospital Association, Doug Leonard, will provide the luncheon keynote address and share his vision for the future of Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs) and the integration of behavioral healthcare into the delivery of primary healthcare services. In addition, attend this luncheon keynote address to get a real sense of the perspective on how the Affordable Care Act has impacted hospital organizations throughout in Indiana and what challenges and opportunities these changes present for the IHA membership.

Under Section 2703 of the Affordable Care Act, opportunities exist for states to improve care for Medicaid enrollees with chronic health conditions, including chronic behavioral health conditions, by providing enhanced federal funding for comprehensive care management and coordination, health education, and improved health outcomes. Consequently, there are a number of reasons why it is important for CMHCs to continue to broaden our scope of service delivery by assuming the responsibilities of an integrated care environment and healthcare homes for the individuals we serve. The development of the Rapid Cycle Change Plan will afford the opportunity for community mental health center executives to quickly prepare for this changing health eco-system and ensure that our system of care continues to be leaders in the treatment of severe mental illness and substance use disorder.
